

Awards Night Host



Jeremy Vine

Jeremy Vine's daily programme, The Jeremy Vine Show on BBC Radio 2, is now the most listened-to radio news programme in the UK, having overtaken BBC Radio 4's flagship Today — not that Jeremy likes to mention that much. He also presents a daily topical programme on Ch5, as well as Eggheads and the BBC election graphics.

Jeremy was named Speech Broadcaster of the Year at the Sony Awards in 2005 and 2011 and won Interview of the Year for the famous "head-in-hands" moment with Prime Minister Gordon Brown shortly before Mr Brown lost the 2010 election.

Vine has also presented BBC1's Points of View and was one of only four anchors in the history of Panorama, the world's oldest current affairs show. The others are David Dimbleby, Richard Dimbleby and Sir Robin Day.

Jeremy studied English Literature at Durham University, and in 1986 began his career as a trainee reporter at the Coventry Evening Telegraph, in the days of manual typewriters and hot metal presses. After that he was a BBC news trainee, Today reporter (the Yugoslav war and sheep racing in Dorset), political correspondent during the nineties, Africa correspondent based in Johannesburg, and Newsnight presenter — the most frightening assignment of all, working alongside the legendary Paxman.

His autobiography It's All News to Me tells the vivid story of his first 25 years at the BBC. A review in the Daily Telegraph said:

"Jeremy Vine is the perfect diarist, because he is an exhibitionist who doesn't mind looking stupid. So he has written a brilliant memoir detailing his adventures at the BBC, from political correspondent to the Today programme to number three at Newsnight to his present job on Radio 2. Vine is silly and joyful and he has written a silly and joyful book, which I adored."

Jeremy was also on Strictly Come Dancing in 2015, where he scored a 2 for his Cha-Cha-Cha. He is married to Rachel and they live with their two daughters in west London, who he went on Strictly to show off to.

"Everything that goes on with Soldiering On Awards is so inspiring. Hearing all the stories and meeting the incredible finalists really is the highlight of my year."







Christina Johnston

Christina, known as "The Nightingale," captivates audiences across the globe. At 17, she earned a scholarship to London's Guildhall School of Music and Drama, and in 2012, she made her operatic debut at Prague's State Opera as Queen of the Night in Mozart's Die Zauberflöte and Adele in Strauss's Die Fledermaus.

Her career has since flourished at European and Russian Opera Houses, portraying roles like Olympia in Offenbach's Les Contes D'Hoffmann, Zerlina in Mozart's Don Giovanni, and Katerina Cavellieri in Amadeus with The Prague Shakespeare Company.

Christina has sung for prominent figures, including the President of the Czech Republic, the President of the People's Republic of China, and EU Presidents. She was chosen to perform during China's World War II commemoration and Israel's Day of Jerusalem broadcast in Hebrew.

Her voice graces film scores, notably in "Interlude in Prague" (2019), "Battleship Island," and the groundbreaking "Wonder Woman 1984" (2021), the first operatic aria in a DC Comic film. She's been featured at film festivals alongside esteemed composers like Joe Hisaishi, James Horner, Patrick Doyle, Craig Armstrong, Elliot Goldenthal, and Michael Giacchino.

Christina's accomplishments also include her debut CD, "Blessing," with The City of Prague Philharmonic Orchestra, a Christmas EP with Matthew Sheeran, and an invitation from José Carreras to join his Farewell Tour in 2019. Her charity single "A Million Tears" for the Purple Poppy Appeal, supporting the War Horse Memorial, received backing from Queen Elizabeth II and 52 Commonwealth countries, and reached No1 on the Classical charts in February 2022.

The last two summers, Christina has joined Russell Watson on his outdoor concerts with the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra, and in 2023, she embarks on a tour of France and makes her Canadian debut.



The Corps of Drums of The Royal Logistic Corps

The Corps of Drums has a proud history dating back to 1799 when one Drummer from each of the five companies of the newly formed Royal Wagon Train was authorized to replace trumpeters.

Buglers and Drummers undertake a two year tour with the Corps of Drums before returning to their trades ranging from Drivers to Port Operators.

The Corps of Drums are in very high demand for their unique Black Light Drum Display. These displays have taken the Corps of Drums across the Globe, from displays in Northern Ireland and Germany, to performing alongside the US Army's 'Hellcats' Corps of Drums based at West Point Military Academy, New York. The Corps of Drums most recent tours took them to Thailand and Turkey to support The Queens Platinum Jubilee celebrations at the Embassy.











Ryan Truzzi-Franconi

Ryan Truzzi-Franconi is a clarinettist and saxophonist based in North Devon. He started his musical journey at age 11, later studied music at college and then, at age 18, he joined the prestigious Royal Marines Band, successfully completing three years of military and music training in 2014.

Following training in Portsmouth, Ryan was drafted to the Royal Marines Band, Scotland, based in Rosyth and within three months, he deployed on the hospital ship RFA Argus as part of Op Gritrock, the Royal Navy's medical, musical, and humanitarian response to the Ebola Crisis.

Over the course of his 11-year military service, he enjoyed musical highlights including performances at the Royal Albert Hall, the Edinburgh Military Tattoo, and a two-month tour of America and Canada with the Scots Guards' pipers, drummers, and highland dancers. He also took part in endurance challenges like the Royal Marines 88-mile Lympstone to Poole race and the Spean Bridge Commando Speed March.

In 2022, Ryan was medically discharged and has since pursued a career as a solo saxophonist, performing at weddings and events whilst furthering his music study and indulging his passion for jazz.



Inspiration Award

Jacqui Swan-De La Maziere

Jacqui Swan-De La Maziere is a former Royal Navy Radio Operator, who joined the Armed Forces with the aspiration of a lifelong career and the opportunity for advancement. Her dreams were shattered in 1992 when she was interrogated and dismissed for being gay.


Jacqui went on to organise petitions to parliament on the issue of restorative justice, writing newspaper articles and appearing on TV.



Mark Harding

In 2010, LCpl Mark Harding's platoon came under Taliban fire and he was shot by a sniper. The bullet severely injured his spinal cord causing paralysis from the neck down. Mark battled through his recovery and achieved his goal of walking again.

He has also given back to those in need, by undertaking challenges and events, raising thousands of pounds for ABF The Soldiers' Charity.



Natasza (Tash) Telfer

Natasza Telfer's career in the Royal Horse Artillery was sadly cut short after her last tour to Iraq. Following injury, she was told that she wasn't going to recover.

She lives with unimaginable pain in both legs, both hips and back, is unable to walk unaided, and weathers the demons of PTSD. However, she manages to bring a bright light and infectious laugh to everyone she meets, and is an integral part of the Purple Warriors charity supporting impaired veterans.

Dr Aamer Khan is a world-class skin specialist who provides free-ofcharge medical treatment, including reconstructive surgery, to severely wounded veterans, particularly those with facial disfigurement or burns.

Dr Khan is available 24/7 if a veteran needs him – free of charge. With this dedicated, selfless approach, Dr Khan has - on several occasions - prevented veterans from taking their own lives.

Blind Veterans UK Brighton Centre

After over 80 years of proud service, Blind Veterans UK will be closing the doors of their iconic Brighton centre this year. The charity will be moving to a new home along the Sussex coast that they have purchased from the RAF Benevolent Fund.

The care and rehabilitation provided has transformed the lives of tens of thousands of visually impaired veterans over the eight decades the charity has had a home in Brighton.

Anthony de Putron Gauvain

Having left the Army, Tony Gauvain trained to become a qualified therapist and established the charity PTSD Resolution in 2009

Tony has run the charity as CEO and Chair and receives no payment for the time he gives. He set up a UK-wide network of 200 registered therapists, sourced trustees who were passionate about veteran mental health, and raised the money to pay for the therapy required.



Right Management has worked in partnership with the Ministry of Defence for 25 years, delivering highly successful resettlement programmes through the Career Transition Partnership.

Phoenix Heroes CIC focuses on mental health support and wellbeing initiatives by creating veteran and Armed Forces communities through outdoor activities such as carp angling, football, and family days.

The team has committed over 32,000 voluntary hours to creating a strong peer support environment for hundreds of people across the UK, delivering 110 events and bringing together over 1,000 veterans and families.



Military Assistance Social Hub

The closure of a local veterans' support centre in Bridlington three years ago was a blow to the local Armed Forces community, but the gap it left behind inspired the creation of the Military Assistance Social Hub (MASH).

MASH has since grown to include groups in Bridlington, Beverley, and Withernsea. Together they provide a regular meeting place and activities for former military personnel, as well as their families and friends.



Mutual Support

Mutual Support was founded 31 years ago to provide support for military personnel, veterans and their dependants living with Multiple Sclerosis.

It supports, free of charge, a membership of 1200 people, run wholly by volunteers who retain the enthusiasm and dedication from their military background. They provide a range of services, including two annual, funded, respite and wellbeing weekends.

In the first six months of trading activity the company produced over 4500 individual chocolates.

Founder, Phill Jones, has achieved this while preparing for his transition and serving full-time as a WO2 in the Defence Academy.



AlphaOne Electrics

Recognising the growing demand for sustainable energy and the poor Electric Vehicle infrastructure in Cornwall, RAF veteran Daniel Sylvester formulated a plan.

With the help of a Start Up Loan, he invested in retraining to qualify in installing EV charging points and launched AlphaOne Electrics with this specific focus.

Now with a team of five, including two veterans, Dan is having a positive environmental impact in Cornwall.



Carma

Inspired by a friend helping veterans with PTSD through nature-based therapy, Jim Holland wanted to play a part in helping both fellow veterans and the environment.

He founded Carma in May 2021, whose mission is to 'remove 1bn tonnes of CO2 from our atmosphere'.

Carma provides businesses and consumers with simple and affordable methods of making a social and environmental impact by buying trees planted by veterans with PTSD.

They registered as an Independent Alternative Provision with the local education authority and rapidly became the leader in their field, with the next step being registration with OFSTED.



Sir Fix-a-lock

Paul Montgomery founded Sir Fix-a-lock whilst serving in the Army. This meant that when his military career officially ended, Paul was ready to hit the ground running.

He had established a strong client base and with three years profit under his belt, he had been able to invest in everything he needed, including a new van and thousands of pounds worth of tools.

He is ready to grow and move on to the next phase in Sir Fix-a-lock's development.




Tin Trousers

Additionally, a hugely successful veterans and families project is well underway, providing peer-to-peer support and therapeutic, tailored counselling services.



South Coast Commercial Cleaning Group

After leaving the Army, Simon Poland suffered the tragic loss of his baby daughter and his mother, and was left with PTSD. He started window-cleaning to earn money and restore his physical and mental strength.

Today, South Coast Commercial Cleaning Group has a team of twelve and hundreds of regular customers. Simon received a commendation from HRH The Duke of Kent for his voluntary work during Covid-19 and national acclaim for climbing Mount Everest in aid of a local children's hospice.

Scott Meenagh

Scott Meenagh lost both of his legs after stepping on an IED in Helmand Province in 2011. One of his best friends was also blown up and killed as he and colleagues carried Scott from the minefield. Scott decided that he had to live for two lives.

Scott got a taste for Para Nordic skiing during Sochi 2014, came second at the 2023 World Para Nordic Skiing Championships, and competed at the 2018 and 2022 Winter Paralympics.

His courage, endurance, and humanity are beyond measure.

Glyn Barrell

Glynn Owen Barrell was medically discharged from the 40th Regiment Royal Artillery after 12 years but refuses to let his limitations restrict his options and adventures.

Glyn was introduced to the Purple Warriors charity Dragon Boat club when he was in a very dark place mentally in his life and felt worthless and lost. Since then, he has competed for Team GB 'Grand Dragons', the only disabled person in the boat, and was crowned World Champion in outrigging. Glyn attests that the Dragon Boat experience saved his life.

Sgt Jade Ives

Sgt Jade Ives is an Army Medic and a dedicated member of the Army Medical Services Ladies Football team. Following a severe back injury, Jade was told it was unlikely she'd ever return to fitness, let alone play sport.

However she has defied the odds and is back to playing the sport she loves, plus supporting the team management and administration. Her injury has not defined her but shown how strong she is, both physically and mentally. Her passion for sport is truly inspiring - this is a woman you want on your team.


TechVets

Pete Lewin Newfoundlands

Pete Lewin Newfoundlands is a nonprofit organisation that offers emotional support to veterans who may benefit from swimming and interaction with Newfoundland dogs.

The charity is run by Pete Lewin, a paramedic with over 30 years' experience in the East Midlands Ambulance Service, who has seen his fair share of mental ill-health.

Over Summer 2022, 60 members of the Armed Forces community - including serving soldiers from 7th Infantry Brigade, were supported thanks to funding of £6000 secured from Leicestershire County Council.



Jonathon Giemza-Pipe and Baxter

Jonathon Giemza-Pipe was medically discharged in 2016 after 22 years in the Army, and really struggled to regain direction in his life. However, nothing could have prepared him for the incredible impact a canine partner would have on his life!

Baxter changed Jonathon's entire outlook and helped enable him to get back on track and find a fulfilling new career working with Op Courage and helping others with their mental health as a Veterans' Peer Support Worker with Berkshire Healthcare NHS Foundation Trust

Battling On veterans have supported over 1400 vulnerable individuals within local communities. In Plymouth alone, the team has supported 382 care leavers. The veterans also volunteer to support other charities, community groups and Trusts, and on average provide over 5000 volunteer hours back into local communities.

Being a small organisation, Battling On can be agile in adapting its voluntary work to meet the needs of veterans.



Help for Heroes Recovery College

Working together is central to Help for Heroes Recovery College's mission. It works with medical professionals, charity partners, as well as veterans and their family members with lived experience, to co-produce and co-deliver courses that respond to the ongoing needs of veterans and families.

The College also partnered with experts Zero Suicide Alliance, to develop a self-help guide on suicide awareness and prevention.

In 1976 she married a retired Major from the Cheshire Regiment, moving halfway around the world to be with him. She has been a long-term supporter and fundraiser for Combat Stress - her drive and dedication is unstoppable and she continues to raise awareness of the charity.



Reg Charles

Reg joined the 5th Battalion Ox and Bucks Regiment and moved to 1st Battalion in June 1944, before heading to Normandy in July 1944, landing on Gold Beach.

In the Ardennes, Reg would drive a jeep to the front line at night and again in the early morning with supplies for the troops, bringing casualties back from the front line to the field hospital through a minefield. Reg passed away peacefully on 3rd August at the age of 100 and is represented at Awards Night by his daughter, Sheila.
